Fri., 3/19/03 10a-2p	<b>Sauvie Island Wildlife Exploration:</b> The original inhabitants of Sauvie Island were the Multnomah Indians, unfortunately decimated by smallpox. By 1856, most of Sauvie Island was staked out by settlers via the Oregon Trail. In the 1930s the Army Corps of Engineers implemented a dike system to control the annual flooding of the island, and by 1950 the Sauvie Island bridge was constructed to connect the island to mainland. Both of these feats removed the last obstacles to full settlement of the island. To preserve the natural wonder of the area, Oregon Parks and Wildlife set aside 12,000 acres as the Sauvie Island Wildlife Area.
